Perry, who passed away in March 2016 at age 57, was recognized for his outstanding achievements in aviation. Sandra said that Perry always appreciated his upbringing on the family farm near Nobleford and the work ethic that instilled in him. He had roles as a technical crewman with the Snowbirds aerobatic team, an Air Force pilot, and finally a production test pilot for Bombardier Aerospace. While in

Montreal he flew the Challenger, the Regional Jet and his favourite, the water bomber used around the world to fight forest fires — he said it was "real flying," no bells, no whistles. In 1996 he added Engineering Liaison Pilot to his production responsibilities, holding the position of Senior Jet Pilot at Bombardier. Perry was given D.A.D. (Design Approval Designee) status by Transport Canada allowing him to make airworthiness decisions on production aircraft. His career in aviation took him across North America and to various destinations in Asia, Europe and the Middle East.
